Packing for an AMGA Alpine Guide Course, Part 1 - By ...

This course is the entry-level program in both the AMGA Alpine and Ski Disciplines and will open doors for future guides.

Ascent Alpine Skills Course - Sponsored by Eddie Bauer - AMGA

The American Mountain Guides Association (AMGA) Climbing Wall Instructor Certification is for professionals who teach climbing on indoor gyms and artificial climbing walls. This two-and-a-half-day course and exam aims to provide the participants with the technical skills to run an effective program at a climbing facility.

Mountain Guide Training Courses | American Alpine Institute

This course is run through the American Alpine Institute (an AMGA accredited business), who are accredited and approved to accept GI Bill funding. In order to participate on this program, you must: 1) Be a veteran of the US Military (this excludes foreign military veterans)

This is the entry-level course for the Rock Guide and Alpine Guide programs and the Rock Instructor Certification. The Rock Guide Course (RGC) was designed for aspiring guides who have a strong rock climbing background and for instructors who are interested in improving their skills and increasing knowledge.

The AMGA's training courses, exams, and certifications are designed to certify you, the individual guide, with the skills necessary to effectively guide clients in Rock, Alpine, and/or Ski terrain.

The American Alpine Institute's guide training program formed the basis of the AMGA's national certification program for alpine guides, and AAI guides have played leadership roles as the designers, instructors, and examiners in the rock, alpine and ski certification courses and exams.

Mountaineering Instructor Professional Training Program

The American Mountain Guides Association (AMGA) certifies guides in three different disciplines: Rock, Alpine, and Ski. An individual can be certified at a variety of levels in each discipline. Once certified that individual has been deemed qualified by the AMGA to guide within that discipline within certain terrain guidelines (listed below).

About AMGA and IFMGA Mountain Guide Certification

The AMGA Ski and Splitboard Guide certifications are meant for the experienced backcountry skier/ rider or ski guide looking to further hone their skills in off-trail and glacial terrain. It is designed for guiding either ski tours or ski ascents/descents, on alpine touring, splitboard or free-heel equipment.

The Advanced Rock Guide Course/AE (ARGC/AE) covers the tools used when guiding and instructing multiple clients on longer routes up to Grade V—management of 3rd and 4th class terrain, technical descents, simultaneous multi-client belaying, lowering and rappelling, management of transitions, and short roping and short pitching techniques.
