The Muslims of India, Jinnah insisted, are 'a distinctive culture and civilization'. A few historians compared the Partition of the country to the holocaust and called it genocide. Hindus and Muslims have lived together in India for over a thousand years. But the give and take between the two communities is minimal. The Hindu-Muslim relations in India cannot be said to be close and cordial. Though there is no perceptible antagonism between the communities, something appears to be missing; the harmony desired among the compatriots is wanting.
