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### Lexical Priming: A New Theory of Words and Language: Hoey

The theory of lexical priming, put forward by Michael Hoey (2005), suggests that language users store the words in the context in which they have encountered them. Hoey argues that as a result of these multiple encounters we are primed to replicate these contexts in subsequent encounters, whether we read, listen, write or speak.

### Language Awareness: Lexical priming

Priming is a phenomenon whereby exposure to one stimulus influences a response to a subsequent stimulus, without conscious guidance or intention. For example, the word NURSE is recognized more quickly following the word DOCTOR than following the word BREAD. Priming can be perceptual, associative, repetitive, positive, negative, affective, semantic, or conceptual.
