As a starting point, loosen the ignition plate screws and turn the plate ALL the way counterclockwise so it's fully retarded and the points are closed (no voltage at meter or test lamp is off)...slowly turn it back clockwise until the very instant the meter shows battery voltage or the test lamp lights...STOP!!

Set the front cylinder TDC mark JUST on the backside of the timing hole. Use a test light or meter and rotate the plate till the points break and lock it down. I've done my bike this way numerous times with good luck. Sometimes I put a timing light on it and may have to tweak it a tad, not much. I make an external mark for using a timing light.

Locate the proper timing marks for your engine. If the shop manual is not available, remove spark plugs, turn engine until front piston is at TDC on compression stroke and identify TDC mark on the flywheel. 2. Connect leads of INDUCTIVE TIMING LIGHT to front spark plug cable, to battery positive terminal and to ground.

Setting Ignition Timing on your Harley

The Shovelhead engine is a motorcycle engine that was produced by Harley-Davidson from 1966 to 1984, built as a successor to the previous Panhead engine. When the engine was first produced, the Shovelhead had a shallower combustion chamber, larger valve drop

for both intake and exhaust, better porting, and stronger valves and pistons.

Turn engine until both valves are closed on the front cylinder. This is found when you can see both front cylinder tappets in the down position and see the piston at the top through the spark plug hole. Loosen the locknuts on each pushrod adjuster and adjust shorter until pushrod can be lifted out (Fig. 6).

If you're timing the engine as part of a larger repair process (like replacing a timing belt), you'll want to start by getting off on the right foot -- make sure you can locate the timing marks (or notches) on the flywheel and cam. If they're worn or hard to see, you might want to mark them with a bit of white paint so they're easier to see.
