IB-Required Assessments Guidelines for the TOK Essay ...

The maximum word count for a TOK essay is 1600 words (at least it was when I did IB. I'm basically an old man now so it might have changed). It's up to you how many you think are relevant to the development of your essay. What I personally did in my TOK essay was that I included two WOK's for every one AOK I included.

Instead, there are two parts of the assessment: an essay on a prescribed title and, new to this specification, the " TOK exhibition." The essay is marked externally and is worth 67% of the marks. The Exhibition is marked internally (but moderated externally) and worth 33% of the marks.

The essay on the prescribed title must be between 1,200 and 1,600 words in length. Extended notes or appendices are not appropriate to a TOK essay and may not be read. The word count includes: • The main part of the essay • Any quotations. The word count does not include: • Any acknowledgments

It is possible to complete a TOK essay without the need for references. However, if you refer to specific facts or opinions, views and theories of individuals, you need to reference in the usual manner, following IB Academic Honesty principles.

The TOK essay is about knowledge (how we come to know things). It helps to think of the essay as though you're showing the most interesting bits of a conversation between two smart people, about how we know things. Or you could think about it

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like presenting two sides of an argument, in front of a judge. Each side needs to present evidence.

First, if you wonder how to write a good TOK essay, you need to formulate a good essay topic. It should reflect the areas you plan to cover in the essay. Make sure the topic is appealing – it needs to hook readers' attention and make them maintain interest on the whole paper till its very last sentence.

Theory of knowledge. Theory of knowledge (TOK) is assessed through an oral presentation and a 1,600 word essay. It asks students to reflect on the nature of knowledge, and on how we know what we claim to know. TOK is part of the International Baccalaureate® (IB) Diploma Programme (DP) core, and is mandatory for all students.

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Theory of knowledge - International Baccalaureate®

TOK stands for Theory of Knowledge. The TOK essay was conceptualized by the International Baccalaureate. The essay is to be between 1200 and 1600 total words, and is written on one of the topics that the IB has established. These are also known as titles.

Writing a tok essay is not a piece of cake. That is due to the fact that there is a specific format for you to stick to. First of all, find a proper topic, decide, which areas cause the greatest interest in you. Keep in mind that the reader will feel if the writer isn't interested in the topic himself/herself.

An essay with unclear organization will be graded poorly. The body of your EE should make up the bulk of the essay. It should be about eight to 18 pages long (again, depending on your topic). Your body can be split into multiple parts.

The names Elizabeth Eckford and Hazel Bryan Massery may not be well known, but the image of them from September 1957 surely is: a black high school girl, dressed in white, walking stoically in front of Little Rock Central High School, and a white girl standing directly behind her, face twisted in hate, screaming racial epithets. This famous photograph captures the full anguish of desegregation--in Little Rock and throughout the South--and an epic moment in the civil rights movement.
